On this job, the worker first folds the box so that one bottle of epoxy and one bottle of cement can be placed inside the box with the directions by the worker. The boxes are then folded and packaged together. All three workers have performed this specific job in the past. Kevin said that he is selected to do the work because he is such a hard worker, and he works at such a fast pace. Josh also works at a fast pace, but he said that he is very dependable—he "gets the job done!" April states that she is very good at following directions, and she is a quick learner—she knew how to do this job after only one demonstration! The cement bottles that were being packaged in the pictures above are labeled using our Texwrap 1200. Labels are loosely wrapped around the bottles, and then they are placed onto the conveyor belt. When the bottle goes through the machine, the heat allows the label to tighten around the bottle so that the label does not fall off. The labeled bottles come off of the conveyor belt on the other side, as seen in the picture, and they are brought over to be packaged by workers like Kevin, Josh, and April. On March 31, 2014, the Detroit Tigers will start yet another exciting season of major league baseball. There are many people involved in making this experience possible for us. Comerica Park and other businesses employ individuals for a variety of positions, and many of the people who serve patrons are actually volunteers. As soon as the fan walk through the gates, there is someone scanning tickets while security personnel check the fan's belongings before allowing them to enter the stadium. Fans are greeted by a person with a booming voice looking to sell programs. There are also employees offering fans t-shirts, hats, and other memorabilia. Surrounding the stadium, people occupy booths encouraging fans to enter to win giveaways and sweepstakes. Food and beverages are distributed by volunteers running kiosks such as Little Caesar's and Chicago Style Hot Dog. Fans can also purchase food and beverages from their seat, as vendors pass through the stands. These positions among others involve sales to some extent. Comerica Park brings in millions of dollars per game.

For 2012, the Tigers hosted an average of 40,175 fans for the first three games of the season. At this time, the anticipated cost for fans to attend a ballgame was just over \$80.00. 


